

Postal plebiscite on “same-sex marriage”

The Australian Government has announced there will be a postal plebiscite on whether the definition of marriage in the Marriage Act 1961 should be changed to include “same-sex marriage”. Ballot papers will be sent out to households on Tuesday, 12 September and all votes must be received back by Tuesday, 7 November. ***To keep marriage as a unique relationship between a woman and a man, vote “NO”.***

If we vote NO in the plebiscite:

- We send a strong message on family, faith and freedom
